- -Please be aware that grade level determination for the 2024-2025 school year and graduation eligibility at the high school level are guided by the number of units the student earns: 5 units = 10th grade, 11 units = 11th grade, 17 units = 12th grade, & 23 units* = Graduation. (*Student must meet all graduation requirements)



STUDENT CLASS ATTENDANCE

- -Students should arrive at school in a safe manner prior to the 8:15 AM beginning of the school day. An accumulation of more than four tardies to school or class will result in Saturday Work Detail, ISS, and OSS.
- -If a student is absent from school, the student may submit up to five parent notes to the first period teacher to excuse an absence. Beyond five parent notes, documentation from a doctor or other formal entity will be required to excuse an absence. An accumulation of more than 10 unexcused absences will result in a loss of course credit.
