Dual Enrollment Process

Thank you for your interest in the Dual Enrollment Program! The State of Georgia initiative allows high school students to take college courses through an approved college or university for high school credit. The Dual Enrollment funding will pay up to 30-credit hours of college courses (this is normally around 10 classes). **Any credit hours over the initial** 30 will result in an invoice sent to the parent/guardian for payment.

Eastside High School recommends that students begin dual enrollment at the start of their 11th grade year to ensure students stay at the 30-credit hour funding.

To apply for Dual Enrollment, you must follow the high school's registration process as well as the college's application process and you must request funding through GAFutures.org.

While students can apply to any school in the state that has a Dual Enrollment program, the colleges that are typically used by Eastside High School are:

- Georgia State University- Perimeter Campus
- Georgia Piedmont Technical College

It is important to note that students needing Algebra II credit <u>will</u> have to complete the course at Eastside High School. Post-secondary institutions do not offer a course that will meet this graduation requirement.

Students that dually enroll in American Literature and US History will still be expected to take the EOCTs for these classes at EHS to receive high school credit.

Transportation is not provided by Eastside High School. The student and their families are responsible for transportation to and from campus where courses are taken.

Alternatively, most schools offer a vast number of online classes as well. These online classes count as Dual Enrollment credits also.

College Entrance Requirements



Georgia State University- Perimeter Campus:

To be eligible for the Dual Enrollment Program, you must:

- Be a rising junior or senior at an eligible, participating public or private high school or home school program.
- Be on track to graduate from high school or home school.
- Submit the following minimum test scores:
 - o SAT: 530 Evidence-Based Reading and Writing; 530 Math
 - o **ACT:** 20 English or Reading; 21 Math
 - PSAT: 530 Evidence Based Reading and Writing; 530 Math
 - ACCUPLACER: 237 Nex-Gen Reading, 258 Nex-Gen QAS (Math), 4-8
 Writerplacer

- **Students interested in enrolling in a math course higher than Math 1111 College Algebra must take the Math Placement Exam after being admitted to the Dual Enrollment Program.
 - Minimum 3.0 grade point average as calculated by the university.
 - Must have competed Algebra II or higher to take collegiate level math.

Deadlines set by Georgia State University:

Fall Semester: May 1st

Spring Semester: November 1st

Summer Semester: April 1st

Once accepted, students <u>must maintain a 2.0 GPA</u>. Not meeting this requirement may result in dismissal from the Dual Enrollment Program.

College Entrance Requirements



Georgia Piedmont Technical College:

To be eligible for the Dual Enrollment Program, you must:

- Be a rising junior or senior at an eligible, participating public or private high school or home school program.
- Be on track to graduate from high school or home school.
- Have the following GPA:
 - o to register for core courses: 2.5 GPA or Higher
 - o to register for tech courses: 2.0 GPA or Higher
 - Students wishing to register for core classes with a GPA lower than 2.5
 <u>must</u> take the Accuplacer.

Deadlines set by Georgia Piedmont Technical College in collaboration with Eastside High School:

Fall Semester: May 15th.

It is important to note that Georgia Piedmont Technical College does not offer world language courses and students must have competed Algebra II or higher to take collegiate level math. Students are encouraged to complete the world language requirement at Eastside High School. Please meet with your grade level counselor to discuss your options.

Dual Enrollment Application Walkthrough

- 1. Apply to the college(s) of your choice using the following link:
 - a. Georgia State University- Perimeter Campus: https://admissions.gsu.edu/bachelors-degree/apply/dual-enrollment/?applicantspecialty=dual-enrollment
 - i. The title will say Undergraduate, however, continue the application and you will be able to choose Dual Enrollment.
 - ii. Use your personal email address not your school issued email address.

- i. Select first time user and create new account.
- ii. Click "High School Student" for student type.
- iii. Use your personal email address not your school issued email address.
- iv. Students may also apply using a paper packet provided upon request in the guidance department.
 - 1. Scan or take pictures of required documents and email to: dualenrollment@gptc.edu
- 2. Notify Mr. Tate that you have applied for the dual enrollment program and at which college(s).
 - a. Georgia State University- Perimeter Campus:
 - i. Students will submit test scores through their account.
 - ii. Request Mrs. Vaughn (guidance dept.) to send high school transcript.
 - b. Georgia Piedmont Technical College:
 - i. Request Mrs. Vaughn (guidance dept.) to send high school transcript.
- 3. Complete funding application via GAFutures.org.
 - a. Log in to account.
 - b. On your right, you will see a box titled "Trending".
 - i. Click the link for the "Dual Enrollment Funding Application".
 - c. When completing the application, be sure to select **all** colleges and/or universities that you are applying to for dual enrollment.
- 4. Check for updates on the status of your application frequently.
 - a. The post-secondary institutions will communicate with you not your parent.
 - b. Student can view all received and missing required documents.
- 5. Once accepted, notify your grade level counselor.
 - a. An appointment will be scheduled to complete course selection and any required documents needed.
